EARLY YEARS ADVENTURE STARTS WITH

OUR LEARNING TREES

In Early Years we use trees to record our students' learning each term. We send a copy of your child's tree home for your support and contributions. At Beacon Hill we recognise that all our children are individuals and learn in different ways.

The leaves of the tree record anything the child does towards achieving their targets. These endeavours are recorded by all staff with input from parents.

Each branch has a target we will support the children to achieve.

Sometimes learning doesn't follow a set path and we wanted a way to record all those other brilliant things the children do.

Apples are added to the trees to record these moments and inspire us to think what might be the next step for the children in their Learning Adventure!

In Early Years we focus on what the children can do! This information forms the foundation of our trees so we know what skills to build on!

As pupils move into Primary, the Learning Adventure starts by looking at all the skills they are bringing with them from Early Years. We navigate each child's learning map by using the following six criteria:

OUR LEARNING GALAXY

When students move into the Secondary team, the Learning Adventure is shown as the "learning galaxy". This represents learning moving into wider environments.

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Secondary pupils will be working with lots more different staff and peers


Skills from Primary are extended in the Secondary Learning Galaxy.


Stars are used to represent the **new** challenges

Our PARTNERS

We work with many different partners to support our pupils and we're always looking for new opportunities.

At the moment, as well as working with physiotherapists and OTs from Health, we use expertise from music therapy, drama therapy, dance therapy, reflexology, hydrotherapy, horse-based therapy, trampolining, outdoor education and yoga.

We have awards to run MOVE (a physical movement programme)
Portage and School for Parents (based on the principles of Conductive Education) for our Early Years pupils.
We are also proud to hold a Platinum Artsmark Award and be a Royal Opera House Trailblazer school.

All of our pupils have opportunities to link with mainstream schools. Students at Post 16 have the chance to access work and community opportunities that they can continue when they leave us.
